## **PREFACE**

*In 1972 the National Sample Survey Organisation (NSSO) began a quinquennial series of all-India surveys on consumer expenditure, employment & unemployment. In addition to this, an annual series of consumer expenditure surveys was started in 1986, being carried out in NSS rounds which had other subjects of enquiry as their focus. Apart from the main subject(s) of enquiry, a consumer expenditure schedule was canvassed in four households (two households up to the 48th round, 1992) in every surveyed village and urban block. The schedule was enlarged, from the 45th round (1989-90) onwards, to collect some basic information on employment and unemployment. As a result, an annual series of data on both consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment has since then been available.*

*The present report is based on data ("annual series") collected in the 53rd round (January-December 1997) of NSS. The main findings on consumer expenditure and employment are presented, respectively, in Chapter Two and Chapter Three of the report, Chapter One being introductory. The report also includes comparative information from previous surveys. Appendix A gives detailed tables at national level. Appendix B explains the sample design and estimation procedure followed in the 53rd round.*

*The schedule was, as usual, so designed as to obtain, with a minimum of recall error on the informant's part, the total value of household consumer expenditure over a given reference period and its break-up over broad heads of consumption. As in the previous round, there were two types of schedule - one with a uniform reference period of 30 days for collection of consumption data, and the other with reference periods varying over groups of consumption items. According to usual practice, the field work for the survey was handled by the Field Operations Division, the collected data was processed by the Data Processing Division, and the report was prepared by the Survey Design and Research Division of NSSO. I am grateful to the members of the Governing Council of NSSO, the Heads of NSSO's Divisions and their colleagues for their contributions at various stages. The report, I hope, will be useful to planners and policy makers.*

*Comments/suggestions from readers will be most welcome.*

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# Highlights

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## Consumer expenditure

- ⇒ The all-India monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE) during 1997 was Rs 459. Out of it, expenditure on food and non-food items was Rs 255 and Rs 204, respectively.
- ⇒ In rural India, the MPCE was Rs 395, comprising Rs 232, for food and Rs 163 for non-food items.
- ⇒ In urban India, the MPCE was Rs 645, comprising Rs 320, for food and Rs 325 for non-food items.
- ⇒ The all-India urban MPCE was 63% higher than the rural MPCE. Among states, Punjab shows the lowest (12%) and Maharashtra shows the highest (100%) rural-urban disparity.
- ⇒ The monthly per capita consumption of cereals was 12.8 kg in rural areas and 10.3 kg in urban areas.
- ⇒ The average household size for the country as a whole was 5.0 in rural areas and 4.6 in urban areas during 1997.
- ⇒ In both rural and urban sectors, the households are concentrated at a household size of 4 or 5.
- ⇒ Between 1987 and 1997, the share of non-food items in total consumer expenditure has improved from 36%

to 41% in rural India and 44% to 50% in urban India.

- ⇒ At constant prices MPCE has risen by 6 percent in rural areas and by 13 percent in urban areas over the period 1987 to 1997.
- ⇒ The monthly per capita consumption of cereals has declined from 14.4 kg to 12.8 kg in rural areas and from 11.2 kg to 10.3 kg in urban areas over the period from 1987 to 1997.

## Employment and unemployment

- ⇒ The worker-population ratio (WPR) according to the usual status differed between males and females in both rural and urban areas. The ratio was 54 and 22 per cent for males and females in the rural areas and 52 and 11 percent in the urban areas.
- ⇒ The worker-population ratio, according to the usual status including the subsidiary workers (i.e. all workers) during 1997 was 1 percentage point lower than during the previous annual survey (1995-96) for urban males and rural females and about 1 percentage point higher for urban females. It was at the same level for rural males.
- ⇒ In rural India, the proportion of 'all' workers engaged in the agricultural

(primary) sector remained at around 75 per cent for males and increased by about 1 percentage point to 88 per cent for females in 1997 as compared to the previous annual survey

- ⇒ In urban India, the proportion of 'all' male workers engaged in the secondary sector comprising mainly of manufacturing sector, remained at around 34 per cent during 1997, while it went up by about 3 percentage points for females as compared to the previous annual survey.
  - ⇒ The worker-population ratios for adult males and females according to the usual status were the highest for agricultural labour households in rural
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India (males: 90 per cent; females: 58 per cent) and casual labour households in urban India (males: 87 per cent; females: 34 per cent).

- ⇒ While the second quarter of the year 1997, covering the period April to June, had the highest unemployment rate according to the current weekly status for adults in the rural areas, the quarter corresponding to the period October to December, 1997, had the lowest unemployment rates for adults in both rural and urban areas.

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# Chapter One

## Introduction

1.0 The National Sample Survey (NSS), since its inception (1950-51), collected data on household consumer expenditure in every round up to the 28th (1973-74). After the 26th round of the survey, the Governing Council of the NSSO decided to undertake the surveys on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment together once in every five years. Accordingly, 'quinquennial' surveys on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment were conducted in the 27th, 32nd, 38th, 43rd and 50th rounds of NSS, at roughly five-year intervals. In these rounds both survey schedules - sch.1.0 dealing with household consumer expenditure and sch.10 with employment-unemployment - were canvassed in each sample household.

**1.1 Annual series:** The need for an annual series of data on consumer expenditure was also felt at the same time by planners and research workers. The Governing Council, therefore, decided that while the quinquennial consumer expenditure-cum-employment-unemployment surveys would be carried on as before, every other round of the NSS, starting from the 42nd (1986-87), might include a consumer expenditure enquiry on a reduced scale (two or four sample households per sample village/block) with a slightly abridged version of sch.1.0 (abridged with respect to ancillary and auxiliary information). From the 45th round, it was decided to extend the scope of this 'annual' survey by introducing some important questions on activity status of household members to generate some key

indicators on employment and unemployment as well.

1.2 The present report gives the results of the NSS 53rd round survey (January-December 1997) on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment, the tenth of the 'annual' series. In this round, the main enquiry was on survey on small trading units (viz. own-account trading enterprises and non-directory trading establishments) in the unorganised sector. In addition, sch.1.0 for consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment was canvassed in four sample households per sample village/block. In all 6,055 villages and 7,169 blocks were selected for the central sample. The schedule was ultimately canvassed in 23,395 rural households and 28,415 urban households spread over 5,991 villages and 7,137 blocks.

**1.3 Geographical coverage:** The geographical coverage of the survey was to be the whole of the Indian Union except the Ladakh and Kargil districts of Jammu & Kashmir, 768 interior villages of Nagaland and 172 villages in Andaman & Nicobar Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year. However, certain districts of Jammu & Kashmir had to be excluded from the survey coverage owing to unfavourable field conditions.

**1.4 Contents of the report:** The main findings of the enquiry on consumer expenditure are presented in Chapter Two, which discusses the pattern of variation of monthly per capita consumer expenditure

over rural and urban areas of 15 major States and 3 groups of smaller States and Union Territories. Also studied is the distribution of households over household size. Chapter Three presents the key indicators of employment and unemployment obtained from the 53rd round survey. The estimates are based on two approaches followed in NSS surveys for collection of information on employment and unemployment: usual status and current weekly status. To give a comparative picture of the employment situation over the period 1983 (38th round) to 1997 (53rd round), corresponding

results obtained from the earlier surveys are given alongside. The discussion in Chapter Three is confined to the all-India estimates. Some key estimates are presented at broad levels for the major States and certain groups of smaller States and U.T.'s. Concepts and definitions involved in the collection of consumption data are discussed at the beginning of Chapter Two, and those related to employment and unemployment, at the beginning of Chapter Three. Detailed tables at the national level are given in Appendix A. The sample design and estimation procedure are explained in Appendix B.

## Chapter Two

# Household Consumer Expenditure

### Concepts and Definitions

**2.0.0 Household:** A group of persons normally living together and taking food from a common kitchen constitutes a household. The word ‘normally’ means that temporary visitors are excluded but temporary stay-aways are included. Thus a son or daughter residing in a hostel for studies is excluded from the household of his/her parents, but a resident employee or resident domestic servant or paying guest (but not just a tenant in the house) is included in the employer/host's household. ‘Living together’ is usually given more importance than ‘sharing food from a common kitchen’ in drawing the boundaries of a household in case the two criteria are in conflict; however, in the special case of a person taking food with his family but sleeping elsewhere (say, in a shop or a different house) due to space shortage, the household formed by such a person's family members is taken to include the person also. Each inmate of a mess, hotel, boarding and lodging house, hostel, etc., is considered a single-member household except that a family living in a hotel (say) is considered to be one household only; the same applies to residential staff of such establishments.

**2.0.1 Adult:** A person who has completed 15 years of age.

**2.0.2 Household size:** The size of a household is the total number of persons in the household.

**2.0.3 Household consumer expenditure:** The expenditure incurred by a household on domestic consumption during the reference period is the household's consumer expenditure. The household consumer expenditure is the total of the monetary values of consumption of various groups of items, namely, (i) food, *pan* (betel leaves), tobacco, intoxicants and fuel & light, (ii) clothing and footwear and (iii) miscellaneous goods and services and durable articles.

2.0.4 For groups (i) and (ii), the total value of consumption is derived by aggregating the monetary value of goods actually consumed during the reference period. An item of clothing and footwear would be considered to have been consumed if it is brought into maiden or first use during the reference period. The consumption may be out of (a) purchases made during the reference period or earlier; (b) home grown stock; (c) receipt in exchange of goods and services; (d) any other receipt like gift, charity, borrowing; and (e) free collection. Home produce is evaluated at the ex farm or ex factory rate. For evaluating the consumption of the items of group (iii), i.e. items categorised as miscellaneous goods and services and durable goods, a different approach is followed. In this case, the expenditure made during the reference period for the purchase of goods and services is considered to be consumption.

2.0.5 It is pertinent to mention here that the consumer expenditure of a household on food items relates to the actual consumption by the normal resident members of the household and also by the guests, whether during ceremonies or otherwise. To avoid double counting, transfer payments like charity, loan advance, etc., made by the household are not considered consumption for items of groups (i) and (ii), since transfer receipts of these items have been taken into account. However, the item 'cooked meals' is an exception to the rule. Meals prepared in the household kitchen and provided to the employees and/or others would automatically get included in domestic consumption of employer (payer) household. There is a practical difficulty in estimating the quantities and values of individual items used for preparing the meals served to employees or to others. Thus, to avoid double counting, cooked meals received as perquisites from employer household or as gift or charity are not recorded in the recipient household. As a general principle, cooked meals purchased from the market for consumption of the normal resident members and of guests and employees will also be recorded in the purchaser household.

2.0.6 This procedure of recording cooked meals served to others in the expenditure of the serving households only leads to bias-free estimates of average per capita consumption as well as total consumer expenditure. However, as the proportions of donors and recipients of free cooked meals are likely to vary in opposite directions over the expenditure classes, the nutritional intake derived from the consumer expenditure survey data may present a somewhat distorted picture. These derived nutrition intakes may get inflated for the rich (net donors) and somewhat understated for the poor (net recipients). This point has to be kept in mind while

using the NSS consumer expenditure data for any nutritional studies relating to the nutritional status of households.

**2.0.7 Value of consumption:** Consumption out of purchase is evaluated at the purchase price. Consumption out of home produce is evaluated at ex farm or ex factory rate. Value of consumption out of gifts, loans, free collection and goods received in exchange of goods and services is imputed at the rate of average local retail prices prevailing during the reference period.

**2.0.8 Monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE):** For a household, this is its 30 days' total consumer expenditure divided by its size. A person's MPCE is understood as that of the household to which he or she belongs.

**2.0.9 MPCE class:** For classifying households or persons by monthly per capita expenditure level, 12 classes have been formed in each sectors - rural and urban. The MPCE classes were formed as follows:

The class limits for each sector were chosen in such a way that first and last two classes contained 5% of the population and remaining eight classes contained 10% of

population of each sector based on 50th round data.

**2.0.10 Major States:** The term will be used to denote the following States of India: Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Bihar, Gujarat, Haryana, Karnataka, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Orissa, Punjab, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal. The remaining States and Union Territories of India are divided into three groups, viz. North-Eastern, North-Western and Southern, for the purpose of presentation of estimates. These groups have been formed as follows:

**2.0.11 North-Eastern:** Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura.

**2.0.12 North-Western:** Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Chandigarh and Delhi.

**2.0.13 Southern:** Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Goa, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry.

**2.0.14 Reference period:** In collecting data on consumption, the adoption of a reference period always involves a difficult choice. Too short a reference period (such as one day) gives rise to irregular data as a household's consumption expenditure does fluctuate a great deal from day to day, or from week to week. Too long a reference period, on the other hand, can introduce a good amount of recall error into the data. The annual series of consumer expenditure surveys, up to the 49th round, used a uniform reference period of 'last 30 days' for all items of consumption. In the bigger surveys of the quinquennial series, an additional reference period of 'last 365 days' was used for some items of consumption - particularly, clothing,

footwear and durable goods - but most results were tabulated using the 'last 30 days' data. During the 51st and 52nd rounds, one-half of the sample of households were subjected to schedule type 1, which had a reference period of 30 days throughout. In the other half of the sample, a schedule (schedule type 2) with different reference periods for different items was tried out on an experimental basis. The reference periods for schedule type 2 were:

food, pan, tobacco and intoxicants	last 7 days
fuel & light, miscellaneous goods & services, and medical (non-institutional)	last 30 days
educational, medical (institutional), clothing, footwear and durable goods	last 365 days

**2.0.15 Milk and milk products:** This includes ghee, butter, curd, ice-cream, etc. Milk-based sweetmeats (*pera, rosogolla*, etc.) come under 'beverages, refreshments and processed food' unless they are prepared from milk, sugar, etc., within the household. In the latter case, consumption of milk, sugar, etc., are accounted separately instead of the entire consumption being accounted under 'milk products'.

**2.0.16 Clothing:** This category includes bedsheets, bedcovers, pillows, curtains, mattresses, blankets, rugs, mats and mattings, cotton yarn, wool and knitting wool. It, however, **excludes** tailoring charges, which come under 'miscellaneous goods and services'.

**2.0.17 Miscellaneous goods and services:** This is a residual group containing items other than food, pan, tobacco, intoxicants, fuel and light, clothing, footwear, rent, taxes and durable goods.

**2.0.18 Durable goods:** Items included here are distinguished from miscellaneous goods by having a longer expected lifetime of use (roughly, one year or more). Expenditure incurred on repairs and construction of durables used for domestic purpose is included in ‘expenditure on durable goods’.

## Main findings

**2.1.0** The results on level and pattern of monthly per capita consumer expenditure (MPCE) are discussed here for rural and urban areas of 15 major States and 3 groups of smaller States and Union Territories. This apart, the distribution of households by household size is studied. At the end, the results of this round are compared with those of earlier rounds in order to have a comparative picture on consumer expenditure. Here it may be highlighted that the estimates pertaining to consumer expenditure at the State level may suffer from sampling fluctuations. This factor may be kept in view while using these estimates.

## Consumption and Consumer Expenditure

**2.1.1** As mentioned in paragraph 2.0.13, the usual reference period - ‘last 30 days’ - for collection of consumption data in NSS was adopted in only one-half of the sample of households (schedule type 1). In the other half (schedule type 2), different reference periods - of 7, 30 and 365 days duration - were used for different item groups. The extent and nature of differences in the results obtained by the two approaches is currently under study and is not the subject of this report. According to the programme of releasing estimates of consumer expenditure as an annual time series to fill the gap between the full-scale quinquennial

surveys, the estimates based on schedule type 1 only (uniform reference period of 30 days) are presented here, both because of the similarity in methodology with the previous rounds, and because the distribution of consumer expenditure based on schedule type 1 is noticeably closer to that obtained in the 50th round or in the schedule type 1 of the 51st and 52nd rounds (after allowing for inflation) than the distribution based on schedule type 2 (see Table T1).

## 2.2 Distribution of MPCE

**2.2.1** Distributions of rural and urban households and persons by MPCE class (based on schedule type 1), for each of the 18 States/State-U.T. groups (hereafter referred to as **States**) are given in Statements 2.1 (R & U) and 2.2 (R & U). In addition, Table 1 (Appendix A) gives the total number of persons and number of economically active persons per 1000 households (and their break-up into number of adult males, adult females and children), for each State and for all-India.

**2.2.2** Statement 2.1 also shows the average household sizes in rural and urban areas of the different States. A comparative study of the household size in different States leads to the following broad conclusions.

- Household size for the country as a whole was estimated at 5.0 for rural areas and 4.6 for urban areas.



- In as many as 11 out of 18 States, average household size was 5.0 or above in the rural sector while only 3 States reported the same for the urban sector.
  - Average rural household size was the highest in Rajasthan (5.7), UP (5.6) and Haryana (5.5). In the urban sector,
- household size was high in U.P. (5.4), Bihar (5.3) and Rajasthan (5.1).

### 2.3 Distribution of household size

2.3.1 The distribution of households by households by size for different States and all-India is presented in Statement 3. It is

seen that households are concentrated at size 4 or 5 in all the States in both rural and urban areas. The all-India distributions of household size for rural and urban sectors have been presented in Figure 1.

**2.3.2** The number of households having more than 8 persons was very high in Madhya Pradesh (13%), Rajasthan (13%) and Uttar Pradesh (10%) but very low in Tamil Nadu (1%) against a national average of 8%. Households with one or two persons were rather rare in Haryana among major States, where they formed only 3% against a national average of 16%.

#### 2.4 Average MPCE: States and all-India

**2.4.1** The average MPCEs for rural and urban areas of the major States are shown in Figure 2.

- The all-India rural average MPCE was Rs 395. At the State level, average rural MPCE varied between Rs 295 and Rs 670. Punjab (Rs 670), North-Western (Rs 579) and Kerala (Rs 569) were the top three States in terms of average MPCE in rural areas. The rural average


was lowest in Bihar (Rs 295) and Orissa (Rs 298).

- The all-India average MPCE in the urban sector was Rs 645. The State-level average MPCE was under Rs 645 in 8 of the 15 major States. For Kerala, Maharashtra, Punjab, North-Western and Southern, average urban MPCE was above Rs 750. The average urban MPCE was the lowest in Bihar (Rs 492).
- The all-India urban average MPCE was 63% higher than the all-India rural average MPCE. Among the States, Punjab shows the lowest (12%) and Maharashtra shows the highest (100%) rural-urban disparity.

#### 2.5 Per capita expenditure on different items of consumption: all-India

- 2.5.1** Statements 2.4R and 2.4U show the break-up of MPCE by 28 groups of


items of consumption: 14 food groups and 14 non-food groups, for each of the 18 States and for all-India. At the all-India level, more detailed information on consumption pattern is available in Table 3 of Appendix A, where the item break-ups of value of consumption are given separately for different segments of the rural and urban populations classified by MPCE. Table T2 above shows monthly per capita expenditure on selected groups of items. It reveals the following points:

- The monthly per capita consumer expenditure in the country as a whole has been estimated at Rs 459, out of which Rs 255 was spent on food items and the remaining Rs 204 on non-food items.

- In rural India, the monthly per capita consumer expenditure of Rs 395 was split up into Rs 232, on an average, for food and Rs 163 for non-food. Expenditure on food included Rs 87 for cereals and Rs 39 for milk & milk products. Expenditure on non-food included Rs 74 for medical treatment.
- In the urban sector, the average MPCE of Rs 645 was split up into Rs 320 for food and Rs 325 for non-food. Of the food expenditure, only Rs 86 went towards cereals while Rs 63 was spent on milk & milk products. Rs 191 was spent (per person per month) on medical treatment.

- Urban per capita expenditure levels exceeded rural levels for all the item groups except for cereals and pan, tobacco & intoxicants, for which the levels of expenditure were almost the same.

2.5.6 Statements 2.5R and 2.5U show the percentage composition of rural and urban MPCE by the 28 item groups for each of the 18 States and for all-India. It is seen that in rural areas, the share of food in total consumer expenditure varied between the States from 49% in Punjab to 66% in Assam and Bihar. In urban areas, the share of food ranged from 46% to 56%. Interstate variation in the share of food in total expenditure in urban areas is much less compared to that in rural areas. At the all-India level, the share of food in total consumer expenditure was 59% in rural areas and 50% in urban areas. The share of cereals in consumption expenditure was 22% in rural India and 13% in urban India.




## 2.6 Consumption of cereals

2.6.1 Statements 2.6 (R & U) show per capita quantity and value of monthly consumption of cereals at State and all-India levels. It may be noted here (see paragraph 2.0.7, **value of consumption**) that the value of consumption of home produce is imputed at ex farm prices. The main features are summarized below.

- The per capita monthly consumption of cereals was about 12.8 kg in rural India and about 10.3 kg in urban India.
- Rice and wheat together accounted for 11.2 kg of per capita monthly cereal consumption in rural areas and nearly 9.8 kg in urban areas. Thus only about 500 gm of cereals other than rice and wheat was consumed per person per month in urban India as a whole while the corresponding quantity was 1,600 gm in rural India.

- Wheat was the only cereal for which per capita consumption in urban areas exceeded that in rural areas at the all-India level.
- Per capita cereal consumption in rural areas exceeded that in urban areas for every State. Cereal consumption was the highest in rural Orissa, 15.8 kg (3 kg higher than the national average), and the lowest in Kerala, Punjab and Gujarat (10.5 kg). Per capita consumption was only 8.8 kg in urban Punjab and 8.9 kg in urban Gujarat.
- The value of monthly consumption of cereals was around Rs 86 in both rural and urban sectors of the country as a whole. In the rural sector, it was as low as around Rs 60 in Punjab and Haryana, and as high as above Rs 112 in Assam, West Bengal, Orissa and the North-Eastern States. In the urban sector, it


varied from Rs 61 (Punjab) to Rs 129 (North-Eastern States). It was almost the same in both the sectors of Punjab or Haryana.

**2.6.2** At the national level, more detailed information on cereal consumption is available in Table 2 of Appendix A. Table 2 gives quantity in kilograms and values in rupees of per capita consumption during a period of 30 days of important cereals, gram and cereal substitutes for 12 MPCE classes of the population in each sector. It reveals that per capita consumption of cereals showed an increasing trend over MPCE classes in rural sector. In urban sector, it showed an increasing trend in the lower

## 2.7 Trends in consumption of cereals : all-India

**2.7.1** The findings of different NSS rounds from the 43rd and 47th to the 53rd rounds covering the period from 1987 to 1997 on quantity and value of all-India per capita consumption of important cereals are shown in Statements 2.7 (R&U). It is observed that per capita cereal consumption in rural India is declining gradually, the decline being mainly spread over wheat and jowar. The 53rd round data for rural India are consistent with the findings of the previous rounds. The urban data show a decline in per capita consumption of total cereals. But, since the 47th round (July 1990 - June 1991) it

MPCE classes and a decreasing trend among the higher MPCE classes.

remained almost stable, although there has been a fall in the 53rd round.

## **2.8 Trends in composition of household MPCE : all-India**

2.8.1 Statement 2.8 shows the percentage break-up of household MPCE by groups of items of consumption at the all-India level for the 43rd and 47th to the 53rd NSS rounds, separately for rural and urban India. Here, 13 groups of food items and 8 groups of non-food items are considered. The main points of interest are as follows:


- There is some indication of a rise in the share of non-food expenditure in the total expenditure during the period from 1987 to 1997. The share of non-food expenditure in the total expenditure changed from 36% to 41% in rural India and 44% to 50% in urban India.
- Regarding the consumption of individual item-groups, no definite trend is observed.

- The shares of durable goods over the rounds are not consistent.

## **2.9 Other trends**

2.9.1 Trends, if any, in certain other parameters of interest, such as average household size, average MPCE and selected percentiles (20th, 50th and 80th) of the distribution of persons by MPCE, may be studied from Statement 2.9, which gives data for the 43rd and 47th to the 53rd rounds, separately for rural and urban sectors. In addition, it shows average MPCE at constant prices. (For rural areas, CPI for agricultural labourers with base 1960-61 =100 and for urban areas, CPI for urban non-manual employees with base 1984-85 =100 has been used.) Figure 3 shows the changes in average MPCE over a decade in pictorial form. It reveals that at constant prices MPCE has risen by 6 percent in rural areas and by 13 percent in urban areas over the period 1987 to 1997.

# Chapter Three

## Employment and Unemployment

### **3.0 Introduction**

As mentioned in Chapter One, collection of data to generate an annual series of key indicators of 'employment' and 'unemployment' was resumed with the 45th round survey operations. For this purpose, the collection of data was integrated with the annual survey on consumer expenditure with appropriate provision being made in the 'demographic' block of the schedule on 'consumer expenditure'.

### **3.1 Conceptual framework adopted for the survey**

**3.1.1** The main objective being to generate annual indicators of employment and unemployment, the information collected is aimed at classifying the population into different activity categories on the basis of

the activities pursued by the respondents during specified reference periods adopting two different approaches. The approaches are :

- (i) usual status approach with a reference period of 365 days preceding the date of the survey.
- (ii) current weekly status approach with a reference period of 7 days preceding the date of the survey.

The various activity categories along with the corresponding codes used in the 53rd round were as follows :

Codes 61,62,71,72, 82 and 98 were applicable only for current weekly status approach.

Persons reported as engaged in any one or more of the activities listed under the category codes 11 to 72 (11 to 51 for usual status) during the specified reference period constituted the 'working' (or employed) group. A person assigned activity category code 81 or 82 (81 for usual status) was considered 'seeking and/or available for work' (or unemployed). The employed and unemployed together constituted the 'labour force'. Any person reported to be engaged in or as belonging to one or more of the activities under the categories 91 to 99 (91 to 97 and 99 for usual status) was classified as 'not in labour force'.

**3.1.2 Classification according to usual status approach:** In the usual status approach, the status of activity on which a person spent a relatively longer time of the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey is first considered for deciding the principal usual activity status of the person. The activities pursued by a person are grouped into three broad categories: (i) working or employed, (ii) seeking or available for work, i.e. unemployed, and (iii) not in labour force. Within the broad principal usual category

identified for a person, detailed principal status is assigned on the basis of the relative duration of time spent on different activities. A person categorised as 'a worker' or 'employed' on the basis of his principal status is referred to as principal status worker. A 'non-worker' (on the basis of the principal usual activity status) who pursued some economic activity in a subsidiary capacity was considered to be usually working in a subsidiary capacity and is referred to as 'subsidiary status worker'. These two groups, viz. 'principal status workers' and 'subsidiary status workers', together constituted 'all workers' according to the usual status classification. These concepts are identical to the concepts adopted in the past NSS 50th round survey for classification of population according to the usual status.

**3.1.3 Classification according to current weekly status approach:** For classification of persons according to current weekly status, they had to be initially assigned a unique activity status with reference to a period of 7 days preceding the date of the survey. This posed no problem in the case of persons having only one status during the reference

week. But a unique status was assigned to persons pursuing more than one activity during the week by adopting a priority-cum-major-time rule. For assigning broad activity category (status), the status of 'working' got priority over the status of 'not working but seeking/available for work' and the status of 'seeking/available for work' got priority over the status of 'not working and not seeking/not available for work'. But within the broad category of 'working' or 'not working', the detailed activity category was assigned by major activity criterion, i.e., the activity in which a major part of time was spent was considered the current weekly activity. More specifically, a person was considered 'working' (or employed) if he/she was engaged in any one or more of the economic activities (11 to 72) for at least one hour on any one day of the reference week. Further, he/she was assigned that economic activity category (11 to 72) in which he/she spent major share of the working time during the reference week. A person who had not worked for even one hour on any one day of the week, but had been seeking work or had been available for work (although not seeking) at any time during the week was considered 'seeking/available for work' (or unemployed). Others were considered 'not available for work' (or not in the labour force). Each member of the sample household was, thus, assigned a unique activity status for the week. Aggregates of persons under different activity statuses thus assigned provided the distribution of persons by activity during an average week of the survey period.

### 3.2 Definitions

**(a) Economic activity :** Economic activity is any activity that results in production of goods and services that adds value to national product. Such activities include production of all goods and services for market, i.e. production

for pay or profit and production of primary commodities for own consumption and own-account production of fixed assets, among the non-market activities. The entire spectrum of human activity falls into two categories: economic and non-economic activities. The economic activities have two parts: market activities and non-market activities. Market activities are those that involve remuneration to those who perform it, i.e. activity performed for pay or profit. These are essentially production of goods including that of Government services, etc. Non-market activities are production for own consumption of primary products and own-account production of fixed assets. The full spectrum of economic activities as defined in the UN system of National Accounts is not covered in the definition adopted for the current survey or in the previous surveys. The term 'economic activity' as adopted in the survey include:

- i) All the market activities described above i.e. the activities performed for pay or profit which result in production of goods and services for exchange.
- ii) Among the non-market activities,
  - a) all the activities relating to the agricultural sector (industry section 0 of NIC 1987) which result in production of agricultural produce for consumption (including gathering of uncultivated crops, forestry, collection of firewood, hunting, fishing, etc.) and
  - b) the activities relating to the own-account production of fixed assets. Own-account production of fixed assets include construction of own houses, roads, wells, etc., and of machinery, tools, etc., for household enterprise and also construction of

any private or community facilities free of charge. A person may be engaged in own-account construction in the capacity of either a labourer or a supervisor.

**3.2.1** In this context, it may be noted that up to the NSS 49th round the term used was ‘gainful activity’. The above definition is very close to the ‘gainful activity’ concept except for the inclusion of own-account production of fixed assets. The contribution of this component was found to be negligible from a separate tabulation of this component in the 43<sup>rd</sup> round survey and as such the comparability of the survey results will be unaffected by this change.

**3.2.2** According to the international standards, the term ‘economically active population’ comprises persons of either sex who furnish the supply of labour for production of goods and services as defined in the United Nations system of national accounts and balances during a specified time reference period. According to this system, the production of goods and services includes all production and processing of primary products, whether for market, for barter or for own consumption, production of all other goods and services for the market and, in the case of households which produce such goods and services for the market, corresponding production for own consumption.<sup>1</sup> The definition adopted in the NSS follow the above approach very closely except for the ‘processing of primary commodities for own consumption by the producers of these items’, which is not covered by the NSS definition. Further, the international standards use the term ‘economically active population’ as a generic term and

use two other measures, viz. the ‘usually active population’ in relation to a long reference period such as a year and the ‘currently active population’ measured in relation to a short reference period such as a week or a day. Generally, the term ‘labour force’ is used to denote the currently active population. In this report the term ‘labour force’ is meant to imply the population segment comprising the employed and the unemployed. In conventional terms, the employed, unemployed and those in the labour force are defined as follows.

**(b) Workers (or employed)** : Persons who are engaged in any economic activity or who, despite their attachment to economic activity, have abstained from work for reasons of illness, injury or other physical disability, bad weather, festivals, social or religious functions or other contingencies necessitating temporary absence constitute workers. Unpaid helpers who assist in the operation of an economic activity in the household farm or non-farm activities are also regarded as workers.

**(c) Seeking, or available for, work or unemployed** : Persons who, owing to lack of work, had not worked but either sought work through employment exchanges, intermediaries, friends or relatives or by making applications to prospective employers, or expressed their willingness or availability for work under the prevailing condition of work and remuneration, are regarded as those ‘seeking or available for work’ or as ‘unemployed’.

**(d) In labour force and not in labour force**: Persons who either are ‘working’ or ‘seeking or are available for work’ (i.e. are unemployed) during the reference period constitute the labour force. Persons who were not working and at the same time were neither seeking nor available for work during the reference period are

considered to be 'out of labour force'. The persons under this category are students, those engaged in domestic duties, rentiers, pensioners, recipients of remittances, those living on alms, are infirm or disabled, those who are too young or too old, prostitutes, smugglers, etc., and casual workers not working due to sickness, etc.. However, a domestic servant who is considered a member of the employer's household is treated as a worker though he/she may be performing only household chores.

**(e) Worked as self-employed in household enterprises:** Persons who operate their own farm or non-farm enterprises or are engaged independently in a profession or trade on own-account or with one or a few partners are self-employed in household enterprises. The essential feature of self-employment is that the remuneration is determined wholly or mainly by sales or profits of the goods or services which are being produced. The self-employed persons are further categorised into three groups:

**(i) Own-account workers - usual and current status code 11:** They are the self-employed persons who operate their enterprises on their own-account or with one or a few partners and who during the reference period, by and large, run their enterprise without hiring any labour. They may, however, have unpaid helpers to assist them in the activity of the enterprise.

**(ii) Employers - usual and current status code 12:** These are self-employed persons who work on their own-account or with one or a few partners and, by and large, run their enterprise by hiring labour.

**(iii) Helpers in household enterprises - usual and current status code 21:** The helpers are mostly family members who keep themselves engaged in their household enterprises,

working full or part time and do not receive any regular salary or wages in return for the work. They do not run the enterprise on their own, but assist the related person living in the same household running the enterprise. Here it is to be noted that a departure was made in the case of identifying 'helpers' from the earlier surveys. Persons who worked in the capacity of 'helpers' but had a share in their family earnings were not considered to be 'helpers' in the rounds prior to the 50th round of the NSS, but are considered so in the present survey.

**(f) Worked as regular salaried/wage employee - usual and current status code 31:** Persons working in others' farm or non-farm enterprises, both household and non-household, and getting in return salary or wages on a regular basis (and not on the basis of daily or periodic renewal of work contract) are the regular salaried/wage employees. This category not only includes persons getting time wage but also those receiving piece wage or salary and paid apprentices, both full-time and part-time.

**(g) Worked as casual wage labour - usual and current status codes 41 & 51 :** A person casually engaged in others' farm or non-farm enterprises (both household and non-household) and getting in return wage according to the terms of the daily or periodic work contract is a casual labour. Depending on whether they are so employed in 'public works' sponsored by Govt. agencies or local bodies or in other types of work, the casual workers are classified into the two groups, viz. casual labour in public works (41) and casual labour in other types of work (51).

**(h) Had work in household enterprise but did not work due to sickness/ other reasons - current status code 61/62, and had regular salaried/wage employment**

**but did not work due to sickness/other reasons - current status code 71/72 :** Persons engaged in farm or non-farm enterprises or working in others' farm or non-farm enterprises but absenting from work temporarily due to sickness/for enjoying leave or holiday, or for other reasons, belong to these two categories 61/62 and 71/72, respectively, depending on whether they are self-employed in household (farm or non-farm) enterprises or employed in others' (farm or non-farm) enterprises as regular wage/salaried employees.

**(i) Attended domestic duties and was also engaged in free collection of goods, sewing, tailoring, weaving, etc., for household use - usual and current status code 93 :** In rural areas in general and particularly in tribal areas, domestic work usually includes, among other things, a lot of work in free collection of vegetables, roots, firewood, etc., and in spinning and weaving of cloth for household use. Persons found to be regularly spending some of their time in performing the above activities along with household chores belong to this category.

### 3.3 Summary of findings

**3.3.1** As mentioned earlier, in NSS 53rd round, 5,991 villages and 7,137 blocks were surveyed covering 23,395 and 28,415 households, respectively, in rural and urban sectors of India. Two approaches, viz. usual status approach and current weekly status approach, were followed for collection of information on employment and unemployment. The key indicators of employment and unemployment obtained from the 53rd round survey based on these two approaches are presented here. The discussions are confined to all-India estimates only. In order to have a comparative picture of the employment-unemployment situation over the periods

1983 (38th round) to 1997 (53rd round), corresponding results obtained from the earlier surveys, wherever available, are placed side by side. In view of a smaller sample size in the NSS 53rd round as in the other annual surveys, some key estimates are presented at the broad levels only for the major states and groups of smaller states and UTs. in Statements 3.10 to 3.16.3. Detailed all-India tables are given in Appendix A to the report.

**3.3.2** While interpreting the comparative estimates obtained from various rounds, it is to be noted that the results pertaining to 1983, 1987-88 and 1993-94 are based on quinquennial surveys with a relatively large number of sample households, while estimates for other rounds are based on the annual surveys conducted in smaller numbers of households. Further, the 47th and 49th rounds had a survey period of six months only. The 47th round covered the period from July to December, 1991, and the 49th round the period from January to June, 1993.

### 3.4 The employed

**3.4.1** The estimates of number of persons employed per 1000 persons or Worker Population Ratios (WPRs), also called the Work Force Participation Rates (WFPRs), have been obtained according to the usual status and current weekly status. The employed - in terms of usual status, are classified into 'principal status workers' (ps) and 'all workers' (ps+ss - principal and subsidiary status workers taken together). The 'usual status approach' is based on a reference period of last 365 days and provides the long-term picture of employment and unemployment. Therefore, the estimates based on this approach do not reveal the seasonal fluctuations in the activity pattern over the quarters of a year. The 'current weekly status approach', on the other hand, is

based on a week's activity situation and, therefore, reflects the overall effects caused by intermittent changes in the activity pattern during the year. In the following discussions, the term 'usually working' is used to mean both the principal and subsidiary status working.


**3.4.1.1** From the WPRs by sex given in Statement 3.1 for rural and urban India, it is seen that at the all-India level, the employment scenario has remained generally stable over the years 1983 to 1997. According to the usual status, the WPR for rural males is found to have remained at around 55 per cent since 1989-90 (45th round) though it marginally increased to 56 per cent in 1994-95. In the

case of urban males, the WPR has remained at 52 per cent since 1993-94. Some fluctuations are observed in the female work participation rates which vary between 29 to 34 per cent in the rural sector and between 12 to 16 per cent in the urban sector.

**3.4.1.2** The current weekly status proportions show a similar pattern as the usual status proportions. As expected, they are found to be marginally lower than the usual status rates. Further, the current weekly status estimates of WPRs show a tendency to fall over the previous annual round (52nd) except for urban females, for which it tends to increase. The WPRs, however, show a decrease from the

previous quinquennial survey (1993-94) for females. This may be due to the differences in the method of collection of information on employment - unemployment by current weekly status approach in the 50th round. In that round, a detailed information on time disposition was collected for each of the members and the current weekly status was derived from this information.

workers' are given for certain broad age-groups in Statement 3.2. The detailed tables in the appendix provide ASWPRs for 5 yearly age-groups. These have been plotted in the accompanying graph separately for males and females in the rural and urban sectors. From this statement, it can be seen that the WPR for persons of age 15-59 years, who constitute the population of working ages, was 88 per cent for rural males and 80 per cent for urban males. The WPR for children in the

age-group 5-14 years, was 6 to 7 per cent in rural areas and 2 to 4 per cent in the urban areas. These rates have, however, remained the same as compared to the previous annual round.

**3.4.3 Worker population ratio by household type:** The type/nature of work which fetched the maximum income from economic activities of the household during the reference period of 365 days preceding the date of survey determines its

household type. The WPRs (according to ps + ss) for persons belonging to various household types have been obtained for persons of age 15 years and above, and are given in Statement 3.3. The WPR is the highest for the agricultural labour households in the rural and for casual labour households in the urban areas. This is true for both males and females. About 90 per cent of the adult males and 58 per cent of the adult females belonging to the agricultural labour households are working. The WPRs, in the urban areas, are 87 and 34 per cent among the adult males and females, respectively, for the casual labour households. The variation in WPRs by household type is quite prominent, particularly among the adult females. The rates range from 67 to 90 per cent for rural males, 27 to 87 per cent for urban males, 20 to 58 per cent for rural females and from 9 to 34 per cent for urban females.

Persons employed are categorised into

three broad groups according to their status of employment. These groups are: (i) self-employed, (ii) regular employees and (iii) casual labour. The distribution of the usually employed by category of employment is given in Statement 3.4. The basic distribution of the employed in terms of status of employment shows that more than half of the employed in the rural areas are in the 'self-employed' category. The percentages of regular employees among the employed are about 7 for males and 2 to 3 for females in the rural sector. The proportion of the self-employed was slightly higher among rural males and females between the period 1995-96 and 1997. During the same period, in the urban sector, the proportion of the self-

**3.4.5 Distribution of usually employed by broad groups of industry :** The distribution of workers by industry and the shift of the work force away from the agriculture sector (primary sector) to the manufacturing and the tertiary sector is an important aspect in the study of the structure of employment. Statement 3.5 gives the per 1000 distribution of the usually working by broad group of industry. The industries (sections 0-9) are grouped as (i) primary (0), (ii) secondary (1-5) and tertiary (6-9)<sup>2</sup>. It has been established to a large extent from the quinquennial survey results that there is a steady decrease in the percentage of usually working in the primary sector. As compared to the results of the 52nd round

(1995-96), the results of the current round, however, show an increase in the share of employment in the primary sector in rural areas, particularly among the females. The share of the primary sector employment, on the other hand, has steadily declined since 1993-94 in the urban sector. Between 1995-96 and 1997, the share of employment in the secondary sector has increased in urban areas, but the share of the tertiary sector has declined in both rural and urban areas. A comparison with the previous quinquennial (50th) round shows an increase in the share of agriculture in the rural areas. This increase of share is at the cost of both the secondary and tertiary sectors.

### **3.5 The unemployed**

**3.5.1** Two different estimates are obtained from the annual survey data for the 'unemployed', viz. (i) number of persons unemployed based on the usual status classification and (ii) number of persons unemployed based on the weekly status classification. The first estimate relates to persons unemployed for a relatively longer period during the reference period of 365 days and approximates to an indicator of the chronic unemployment. Two estimates of the usually unemployed are presented - usually unemployed in terms of their principal status (ps) and usually unemployed excluding the subsidiary status workers (usual adjusted). Some of the unemployed identified on the basis of principal status might be working in a subsidiary capacity. Hence the unemployment rate derived on the basis of adjusted usual status is expected to be

lower than that based on principal status. The other estimate, i.e. the one based on current weekly status, gives the average weekly picture of unemployment during the survey year and covers both chronic unemployment and intermittent unemployment caused by seasonal fluctuations in the employment of those categorised as usually employed.

**3.5.2 Unemployment rates (URs) :** Number of persons unemployed per thousand persons in the labour force (i.e. total of employed and unemployed) is termed as the unemployment rate. Statement 3.6 gives the UR along with the number of persons unemployed per 1000 persons. As usual, the proportion of unemployed in the population as well as the unemployment rate are higher in urban areas than in rural areas. In rural areas, it is higher among males than among females, but the position is just the opposite in the urban areas. Compared to the previous annual round (NSS 52nd round), the proportions of unemployed in the total population according to the usual status have remained at the same levels except for a marginal increase in the proportion for urban females. According to the current weekly status, the proportion of unemployed has increased substantially among females while it has remained stable for males between 1995-96 and 1997.

**3.5.3** The unemployment rates also show a similar trend between 1995-96 and 1997. Compared to the 50th round quinquennial survey, the proportions of the unemployed as well as unemployment rates show a sharp fall in both the sectors, the fall being more prominent for females and especially for those living in rural areas.

**3.5.4 Unemployment rate by household type:** In Statement 3.3 given earlier, the unemployment rate in terms of usual status, by household type, is presented separately for rural and urban areas of India. The URs have been obtained for persons aged 15 years and above. It is seen that unlike the WPRs, the UR is highest among persons belonging to the ‘others’ category of households. For rural areas, the ‘others’ category includes mainly the households largely depending upon regular wage earnings and households whose major income is from activities other than economic activities. But, for the urban areas, the ‘others’ category comprises households whose major income is from activities other than economic only. Possibly, the households without any working member, i.e. with unemployed members only, form a major part of this

category and that seems to be the reason why the unemployment rate is high in this category of households. Another important fact to be noted is that the incidence of unemployment is the lowest for the households mainly depending on the earnings from self-employment in farm or non-farm business. The reason may be that some of the members of such households work nominally or seasonally in the household enterprises instead of reporting themselves as available for work.

**3.5.5 Under-utilisation of labour time of the usually employed:** In an economy such as ours, where agriculture-based activities are the mainstay of a majority of the population, particularly in rural areas, there is a strong possibility of under-utilisation of labour time or incidence of under-employment. This is because many

of the agriculture-related activities can absorb a large number of persons at a very low productivity level and with a marginal engagement. Moreover, as agriculture-related activities are seasonal in nature, persons may not find enough work in lean seasons, though they may get categorised as employed as per their usual status. A classification of the usually employed by their weekly status helps to reveal the dimension of real engagement of the persons categorised as employed according to their usual status. Statement 3.7 gives the distribution of the usually employed by their current weekly status (taking into account both the principal and the subsidiary status). The corresponding results obtained from the 43rd round onwards are also presented in the statement. Compared to the last couple of annual rounds, in the 53rd round a marginal decrease is noticed in current employment of those who are usually employed. In other words, there is a rise in the under-employment rate during 1997. Results of the previous quinquennial survey, on the other hand, show a decrease in the under-utilisation of labour time for males and an increase for females.

**3.5.6 Change of employment-unemployment over quarters:** The usual status estimates provide the long-term picture of employment and unemployment for a period of 365 days preceding the date of survey. Therefore, the WPRs or the URs obtained for the quarters (sub-rounds) according to the usual status approach do not reflect the seasonal fluctuations in the activity pattern within the year. On the other hand, the estimates according to the current weekly status, based on a week's activity situation, reflect the overall effect of intermittent changes in the activity pattern during the year. The WPRs, URs and LFPRs based on the current weekly status are given in Statement 3.8 separately for males and females and for rural and urban sectors. These rates have been

obtained for persons aged 15 years and above. It is seen from the statement that the period April to June, end of the agricultural season *rabi*, is the lean working season in rural areas: the WPR is the lowest particularly for males and the UR is the highest during the quarter. The period October to December, on the other hand, shows the lowest URs in both rural and urban areas. The LFPRs are the highest during the period July to September for both the sectors.

### 3.6 Sub-Sample Estimates

**3.6.1** As mentioned in the sampling design appended to the report, the first-stage units are drawn in the form of two independent sub-samples of equal sizes for obtaining two independent estimates for a characteristic. Closeness of the two estimates obtained from the two sub-samples for a characteristic can be taken as an indicator of its reliability. In Statement 3.9 below, we present certain key estimates separately for each sub-sample as well as for the combined sample. It can be seen that the estimates obtained from the two sub-samples are rather close to each other except for rural females.

### 3.7 Regional estimates

**3.7.1** In view of the small sample size in the annual surveys on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment, the detailed state-level tables are not presented in the Appendix to the report. Key results are, however, presented for the major states and groups of smaller states and union territories in Statement 3.10 to 3.16.3. The titles of statements are listed below :

The first three statements give the distribution of population by broad activity status according to current weekly status, usual status (principal) and usual status (principal and subsidiary), respectively.

The distribution of the usually working according to the principal status and both the principal as well as subsidiary status by the three broad groups of industry sections, viz. primary, secondary and tertiary, are presented in Statement 3.13. Distribution of the usually employed in the principal and subsidiary statuses by broad current weekly activity ('working', 'unemployed' and 'not in labour force') is presented in Statement 3.14 to give an idea about the incidence of under-employment rates. Statements 3.15.1 and 3.15.2 give the proportion of persons employed and the proportion of persons in the labour force per 1000 persons according to the usual status (principal + subsidiary) for persons of age 15 years and above. Statements 3.16.1 to 3.16.3 give the proportion of persons employed, unemployment rates and the proportion of persons, respectively, in the labour force per 1000 persons according to the current weekly status for persons of age 15 years and above.

The groups of smaller states/union territories are :

- i) North-Eastern : Arunachal Pradesh, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim and Tripura.
- ii) North-Western : Jammu & Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh, Chandigarh and Delhi
- iii) Southern: Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Goa, Dadra & Nagar Haveli, Daman & Diu, Lakshadweep and Pondicherry

Broad activity statuses used for the purpose are :

- (i) self-employed,
- (ii) regular employees,
- (iii) casual labour,
- (iv) unemployed,
- (v) students,
- (vi) engaged in domestic duties
- (vii) others not in labour force.

The estimated total population is given in the last column of these statements for each of the states and group of states. It is to be noted that the population estimates of the NSS are generally lower than the census population figures due to differences in coverage, methodology, etc.. Therefore, these totals can be used to combine the proportions at the desired level only and should not be used for generating absolute figures under any category. To do this, one is advised to use the NSS proportion on either the census population or projected population .

In the statements and subsequent tables a '-' and '0' mean 'no sample persons in the specified class' and 'the estimated value is negligible' cases, respectively.

## Appendix B

### Sample Design and Estimation Procedure NSS 53rd Round

1.0 The fifty-third round of the NSS was mainly devoted to collection of data on economic and operational characteristics of small trading units (viz. own-account trading enterprises and non-directory trading establishments) in the unorganised sector. In addition, data on consumer expenditure and employment-unemployment for its annual series were collected from a thin sample of households.

1.1 **Schedules of enquiry:** The following schedules were canvassed in the 53rd round:

schedule no.	description
0.0	List of households and non-agricultural enterprises
2.41.2	Non-directory Trading Establishments & Own-Account Trading Enterprises
1.0	Consumer Expenditure

1.2 **Geographical coverage:** The survey covered the whole of the Indian Union except (i) Ladakh and Kargil districts of J & K, (ii) 768 interior villages of Nagaland situated beyond 5 kms of the bus route and (iii) 195 villages of A & N Islands which remain inaccessible throughout the year.

1.3 **Period of survey and sub-division of work:** The survey period was from 1st January 1997 to 31st December 1997. It was

divided into four sub-rounds, each of which was of 3 months' duration. An equal number of sample FSUs was allotted to each sub-round. Each village/block was surveyed during the sub-round to which it had been allotted. However, this restriction was not strictly adhered to in A & N islands, Lakshadweep and in rural areas of Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland because of difficult field conditions.

1.4 **Participation of States:** All the States and U.T.'s excepting A & N islands, Dadra & Nagar Haveli and Lakshadweep participated at least on an equal-matching basis.

#### 2.0 SAMPLE DESIGN

2.1 A stratified two-stage sampling design was adopted for the survey. The first-stage units (FSUs) were the villages (panchayat wards in case of Kerela) in the rural sector and UFS blocks in the urban sector. The second-stage units were the OATEs and NDTEs for the trade survey and households for the consumer expenditure survey.

2.2 **Sample size:** The total number of sampling units (i.e. villages and blocks) to be surveyed in the present round was fixed at 13,224 for the Central sample and 14,876 for the State sample.

### **2.3 Allocation of sample FSUs between States/U.T.'s and rural & urban sectors:**

The total all-India sample size of FSUs was allocated to different States/U.T.'s in proportion to the number of workers engaged in OATEs/NDTEs in the respective States/U.T.'s (estimated as number of OATE/NDTE as per EC '90 multiplied by estimated number of workers per enterprise based on NSS 46th round) subject to a minimum allocation given to the State/U.T. depending upon the total number of districts and town classes for the State/U.T. The State/U.T. level sample size was again allocated between rural and urban sectors in proportion to the number of workers.

### **2.4 Rural sector design**

**2.4.1 Sampling frame:** The list of villages showing number of OATEs and NDTEs as per 1990 Economic Census was used for selection of villages in the States/U.T.'s wherever such frame was available. For Kerala, the list of Panchayat wards giving count of OATEs /NDTEs was used as frame for selecting Panchayat wards for survey instead of villages. For J & K, the 1981 census lists of villages formed the frames. For A & N Islands, Lakshadweep and 5 districts of M.P., 1991 census list was used as the frame. For A & N islands, villages remaining inaccessible throughout the year were excluded from the frame. For Nagaland, only villages connected by bus or situated within 5 kms of the bus route were included in the frame.

**2.4.2 Stratification:** Each district generally formed a broad stratum. However, for Gujarat where NSS regions cut across district boundaries, parts of each such district formed a separate stratum. If any district (or part thereof lying in an NSS region in case of Gujarat) had a small

number of trading enterprises, it was clubbed with neighbouring districts to form a broad stratum in order to ensure a minimum allocation.

**2.4.3** To net an adequate number of NDTEs in the sample, each broad stratum was divided into two area types:

- (i) Area type 1 consisting of villages having at least one NDTE.
- (ii) Area type 2 consisting of the remaining villages of the broad stratum.

Where population census frames were used for selection of FSUs, there was no division as above. In such cases, all the villages were classified in area type 2.

**2.4.4 Allocation of sample villages among strata and area types:** The State/U.T. level rural sample size was allocated among the strata in proportion to workers. While allocating as above, it was maintained that NSS region-level allocation was a multiple of 8 and stratum-level allocation was at least 4 but a multiple of 2. This was done in order to allocate at least two FSUs to each of the area types. The stratum-level allocation was again distributed between two area types in proportion to number of NDTEs and OATEs taking into consideration the fact that allocation for each area type was in multiples of 2.

**2.4.5 Selection of FSUs:** Villages were selected in the form of two independent sub-samples from each broad stratum X area type using circular systematic sampling with probability proportional to size, the size being the number of (OATEs + NDTEs) for area type 1 and the number of OATEs (after assigning a size of 1 to the FSUs having no trading enterprise) for area type 2. Where population census frames were used, villages were selected using circular

systematic sampling with probability proportional to population.

## 2.5 Urban sector design

**2.5.1 Sampling frame:** The latest available list of UFS blocks was used as sampling frame for selection of FSUs's for all cities and towns.

**2.5.2 Stratification:** Town classes (broad strata) were formed within each district by grouping cities/towns according to population size as per 1991 census. Composition of the town classes are as follows:

town class code	composition of town class
1	all towns with population less than 1 lakh
2	all towns with population 1 lakh or more but less than 5 lakhs
3	all towns with population 5 lakhs or more but less than 10 lakhs
4/5	each city with population 10 lakhs or more

In case of Gujarat, if any district was spread over more than one NSS region, town classes were formed independently for each part of a district falling within a particular NSS region.

**2.5.3** To net an adequate number of trading enterprises in the sample, each town class was divided into two area types. Area type 1 consists of the UFS blocks designated as 'bazar area' and area type 2 consists of the remaining blocks of the town class.

**2.5.4 Allocation of sample blocks among districts, town classes and area types:** The State/U.T. level urban allocation was done among the districts and town classes in proportion to the number of workers. It was, however, ensured that NSS region level allocations were in multiples of 8 and town class level allocations were at least 4 and were in multiples of 2. Town class level allocations were further made between two area types in such a way that UFS blocks of area type 1 got completely surveyed (Central and State samples combined) subject to a maximum of 50% of allocation for town class level. Area type wise allocations were in multiples of 2.

**2.5.5 Selection of blocks:** For both area types, sample blocks were selected circular systematically in the form of two independent sub-samples with equal probabilities.

**2.5.6** The allotted number of sample first stage units (FSUs) along with surveyed FSUs, households and persons are shown in Table S by state and sector.

**2.6 Sampling of households:** Four households were selected from each FSU for Schedule 1.0. All the households of the selected village/block were first arranged according to their means of livelihood and then 4 of them were selected circular systematically with equal probability. Sch. 1.0, type 1 was canvassed in the households selected from the FSUs with odd sample FSU nos.(i.e. odd order of selection nos.) and sch 1.0, type 2 was canvassed in the households selected from FSUs with even sample FSU nos. (i.e. even order of selection).
